A Message from the President *Lisa Bailey*

MOAA's current legislative agenda items include a hard focus

on protecting surviving spouses. The association recently pushed federal lawmakers to end

the "widows' tax" on military survivors. Under current law, survivors of deceased military members must forfeit part or all of their purchased Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) annuity when they are awarded the VA's Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC).

The loss of any portion of the SBP annuity is known as the widows' tax. For approximately 67,000 military survivors, the widows' tax makes SBP the only insurance product in the country that you pay into but are legally prohibited from collecting. DIC is a VA-paid monetary benefit for eligible survivors whose sponsors died of a service-connected injury or disease.

These separate benefits are paid for separate reasons and should not be construed as duplicative compensation. Surviving spouses of active duty or retired servicemembers who died of a service-connected cause are forced to forfeit \$1 of their military SBP annuity for each \$1 received in DIC. This offset wipes out most or all of the SBP check for a majority of survivors, totaling approximately \$12,000 annually, including those whose servicemembers purchased the plan through deductions from their retired pay.

As both a retired military officer and a surviving spouse, this issue is near and dear to me.

Congress, we need your help • Support H.R. 553, sponsored by Rep. Joe Wilson (R-S.C.) • Support S. 622, sponsored by Sen. Doug Jones (D-Ala.).

Our Fort Rucker chapter includes over thirty surviving spouses who receive our newsletter. I hope that by reaching out, our chapter can help bring attention to this cause.

You may not be aware of it, but MOAA has started a virtual chapter for surviving spouses that meets once a quarter by telephone conference. The group was started by six women who serve on MOAA's Surviving Spouses Advisory Council: Gail Joyce, Micki Costello, Patricia Berquist, Pat Farnsworth, Sharon DeVaney and Anne Hartline. Legislative Report by Charlie Wigglesworth

Summer is about here and pray all will have a safe summer. Our leadership at the National Headquarters continues to work hard to protect our benefits. The



new director for the Military Coalition (a group of over 30 military affiliated organizations) is going to be headed by the current Executive Director for the Warrant Officer Association. MOAA is one of the largest organizations in the coalition. Also, there is a move to form a Military partnership in the Wiregrass consisting of MOAA, WOA, AUSA, and AAAA. More to follow in future letters.

The following important issues are currently being worked at National level. Be sure to contact your elected officials on these issues.

Ensure Safe Housing for Military Families— Military families face health threats in their homes, it can be harder for service members to focus on their mission. Congress is considering legislation to address health threats in base housing—by remediating environmental hazards, establishing strong tenants' rights procedures, and restoring proper oversight of construction and maintenance contractors.

Act now to improve survivors' benefits—S.1047 would align Dependency and Indemnity Compensation payments with other federal survivor benefits.

Do not Cap Pay or Cut Benefits—Military pay and benefits matter. But apparently not to the Congressional Budget Office. On its list of budget options for lawmakers to consider are capping your pay raises and cutting back BAH. Military families depend on BAH, and it's only right that military pay keep pace with civilian salaries.

Do Not Dismantle Military Medicine - The Defense Department's fiscal 2020 budget calls for the elimination of approximately 18,000 military medical positions. This is roughly 20% of the military's medical force.

Do not Raise TRICARE Fees—Think your health care already costs enough? So do we. But jacking up your TRICARE fees and out-of-pocket costs is on the list of budget options for lawmakers to consider. That would ignore the price military retirees and their families have paid up front with their service and sacrifice.

Support full concurrent receipt for disabled military retirees—Act now to support H.R. 333, the Disabled Veterans Tax Termination Act. This bill provides full concurrent receipt for disabled military retirees, including Chapter 61 retirees.

Act now to end the Widow's Tax—Current federal law requires survivors of deceased military members to forfeit part or all of their purchased Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) annuity when they are awarded the VA's Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC). This loss of any portion of the SBP annuity is known as the widows tax. For approximately 66,000 military survivors, the widows tax makes SBP the only insurance that you pay into but are legally prohibited from collecting.

Lt. Gen. Dana T. Atkins, USAF (Ret.), president of MOAA headquarters, participated in the inaugural meeting. Spouses' input benefits MOAA at large, he said, adding that as word gets out about the group, it'll continue to grow. That will have a powerful effect. Dr. Blake Busbin is a three-time graduate of Auburn University, finishing his doctorate in social studies education in 2013. Following the completion of his Masters Degree in 2007, he joined the faculty at Auburn High School. During his tenure at Auburn High School, he has launched a major public history project with his students documenting the stories of veterans and fallen heroes, the AHS Veterans Project. Through this effort, students have interviewed more than 250 veterans for the Library of Congress Veterans History Project and located several hundred pictures for the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Fund[™] and Wall of Faces project.

In recognition of his work, he received the 2015 Christa McAuliffe Reach for the Stars Award by the National Council for the Social Studies and was named the 2017 Alabama History Teacher of the Year by the Gilder Lehrman Institute for American History, which also named him a top ten national finalist. In 2018, he was a a Top Four finalist for Alabama Teacher of the Year. He is married to Anne Busbin, also a graduate of Auburn University College of Education, who is the school counselor at Richland Elementary in Auburn. They have three children: Parks, Campbell, and Miller.



We also would like to extend our congratulations to Dr. Blake Busbin for receiving the Bennie Adkins Loyalty Award last November at the Youth Leadership Development Program/Dave Wood Patriotism Program in Birmingham in appreciation for his hard

work and loyalty to honor Alabama's Vietnam Veterans. If you recall, CSM (Ret) Adkins, Medal of Honor recipient, spoke at our June 2017 meeting.


