

Just when you think we are in the clear, COVID changes its shape and decides to attack in a different direction. There are no guarantees in life except death and taxes so


I do my best to be safe and took my vaccination. I have lost too many friends and former Soldier friends. Please be safe and health.

There is a move afoot to change the eligibility for burial in Arlington. Be sure to stay abreast of the changes and as I get more info I will pass along.

A recently published report from the Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS), a nonpartisan think tank, has repackaged old, outdated stats to argue military personnel costs are too high and "unsustainable." They are also talking about us retirees.

The author's suggestions include cutting annual pay raises, putting more money into skill-targeted bonuses, shifting more health costs to military beneficiaries, and considering further housing allowance reductions, among others. Bottom line, they are always looking for ways to cut our earned benefits. This is outdated data that was

repackaged and published. MOAA is working to ensure correct info is put out.



"The country's 19.5 million veterans 65 and over account for nearly half of emergency department visits at VA hospitals — more than double the rate for seniors nationwide," said VA Acting Under Secretary for Health Dr. Steven L. Lieberman. "Our goal is to lower this number by ensuring VA's elderly population receives age-friendly emergency care, while improving care coordination in communities across the nation." As many of us are in that age group, it is good that the VA is working to take care of us "Older Members."

VA & COVID-19—"COVID-19 booster shots and additional doses: We follow Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance on booster shots and additional COVID-19 vaccine doses. Booster shots aren't available yet, but we'll update you here when we have more information about where and when you can get one....

"The difference between an additional dose and a booster shot: A booster shot is for people whose immune response may have weakened over time....

"Who can get an additional vaccine dose? The CDC now recommends a third vaccine dose for certain groups of people with weakened immune systems who received either the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.... They may benefit from a third dose to make sure they have enough protection against COVID-19. Note: At this time, we're offering additional vaccine doses only for people with weakened immune systems.... Starting in mid-September, the CDC is expected to recommend a booster shot for anyone who received either the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine. When that begins, you should be able to get a booster shot 8 months after you received your second dose.

"You may be able to get a third dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccine if any of these descriptions are true for you: (1) You currently receive cancer treatment for tumors or cancers of the blood; (2) You have advanced HIV (see VA page 4)

(VA from page 3) (meaning you have a low CD4 cell count) or you have HIV and aren't on treatment at this time; (3) You received an organ transplant and take medicine to suppress your immune system; (4) You received a stem cell transplant within the past 2 years or are taking post-transplant medicine to suppress your immune system; (5) A health care provider has diagnosed you with a moderate-to-severe primary immunodeficiency (like DiGeorge or Wiskott-Aldrich syndrome); and (6) You currently take high-dose corticosteroids or other medicines that may suppress your immune system.

"If your condition or medication isn't on this list and you think you have a moderately to severely weakened immune system, contact your health care provider.

"What to know before you get a third vaccine dose: You need to get the same vaccine for all 3 doses. You should get your third dose at least 28 days after your second dose. You don't need to get your third dose at the same facility where you got your first 2 doses.... Confirm that the facility has the vaccine you need before you schedule an appointment for your third dose. And bring your vaccine record card with you when you come in so we can record your third dose.

"How to get your third vaccine dose at VA if you're eligible, if you're a Veteran who receives health care through VA: If you're eligible for a third vaccine dose based on the information in your VA health record, we'll contact you when we have a vaccine for you. This may take some time. If we don't contact you, you can call or send a secure message to your VA health care team. They can tell you if you can get a third dose at this time and help you schedule an appointment."


