Remember to patronize the twelve sponsors of our newsletter. They help to support the chapter and deserve our consideration.





Membership Spotlight

COL (Ret) Frank Estes is our newsletter editor and lives in Ozark. He was born in 1938 in Gadsden, AL, and graduated from Spring Gardens High School in Cherokee County, AL. He graduated in 1960 from Jacksonville State University with a bachelor's degree with an emphasis in math and chemistry. While participating with the ROTC during his 4 years, he was also a member of the band, ROTC drill team and cheer leading squad. This is where he met Ann Oliver from



Tallahassee, FL, his college sweetheart. Upon graduation, they married and Frank received his commission as a 2LT and entered into active duty at Fort Sill, OK, as an artillery officer. During his military career which included a variety of military courses, he also obtained a master's degree in public administration from Auburn.

During his 30 year Army career he served in many posts including battalion commander, brigade commander, instructor pilot, staff officer at the Pentagon (twice), Deputy Assistant Commandant (responsible for all Army Aviation Center training programs) and finally Chief of Staff at Fort Rucker. He accumulated 3,800 total flying hours including 1,000 combat hours (during 2 tours in Vietnam). He was instrumental as the principal author of the 960-page report that resulted in the decision in 1983 to create Aviation as a separate branch within the US Army. During his military service he was awarded a wide variety of medals/awards including the Legion of Merit, the Distinguished Flying Cross, and Purple Heart (twice).

Frank retired from military service in 1990 after 30 years of service and he and Ann have lived in Ozark ever since. They have one daughter and two grandsons. He has since worked in a wide variety of civilian jobs including positions with the military maintenance contractor for Fort Rucker and with various aerospace corporations as a subject-matter-expert and technical advisor. He has volunteered and worked with many civic and community organizations including the First United Methodist Church of Ozark and the Ozark Boys and Girls Club, to name only two. In addition, he is an avid turkey hunter and outdoor sportsman. He hunts frequently on family property in Florida.

Legislative Report by Ray Collins



Legislative Affairs. We are now within a month of

entering, once again, into the new year without a signed National Defense Authorization Act. Both the House and the Senate leave Washington on the 14th and 15th of December respectively for the Christmas break. Although the NDAA is one of our most reliable pieces of legislation, having been signed into existence for 62 consecutive years, it seems that it is being passed later each year and Continuing

Resolution is the norm rather than the exception. Failure to complete the NDAA process, even when Continuing Resolution is in effect causes tremendous stress on recruitment, retention and morale.

One of the hardship issues the House is attempting to at least begin correcting is adding a one percent raise in the percentage level of Basic Housing Allowance which would cap BAH at 96 percent of that authorized by rank.

Making up the 12 percent deficit that Dependency and Indemnity has fallen behind other veteran survivor programs has become a point of attention primarily due to veteran advocacy pressure. A bill in the Senate S 414 and the House H.R.1083, Caring for Survivors Act, bears witness to that fact. The PACT Act implementation has seen more than four million toxic screenings accomplished since September of 2022. Of the 551 thousand claims filed 78 percent have been approved.

GET YOUR VA MEDICAL RECORDS ONLINE

Review, print, save, download, and share your VA medical records and personal health information with our online tools.

Sign in to manage your VA medical records:

Sign in with your existing **Login.gov**, **ID.me**, **DS Logon**, or **My HealtheVet** account. If you don't have any of these accounts, you can create a free **Login.gov** or **ID.me** account now.

What you can do when you sign in:

- Download a customized Blue Button report with information from your VA medical records, personal health record, and in some cases your military service record
- ◆ Download a Health Summary that includes specific information from your VA medical records (like your known allergies, medicines, and recent lab results)
- Build your own personal health record that includes information like your self-entered medical history, emergency contacts, and medicines
- Monitor your vital signs and track your diet and exercise with our online journals
- Share a digital copy of the personal health information you entered yourself with your VA health care team through secure messaging

Urge Legislators to Back Bill for Survivors of Veterans

Dipartisan legislation in the House and Senate (H.R. 1083/S. 414) would align Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) payments with other federal survivor benefits. DIC is a monetary benefit paid to the survivors of veterans with service-connected disabilities and survivors of

servicemembers who died while serving on active duty.

DIC is paid at a monthly rate of \$1,562.74, with additional allowances in certain circumstances. That works out to 43% of what a veteran with a 100% service-connected disability rating receives from the VA. By contrast, federal survivor programs provide up to 55% of

a civil servant's pay, computed as if the employee retired on disability at the date of death.

This disparity is unfair to the surviving spouses of veterans who lost their loved ones due to military service.

Ask your legislators to show their support for the Caring for Survivors Act and make a long-overdue correction to this injustice.






