A Message from the President Lisa Bailey

Our chapter receives many requests for assistance, both financial and personal. Last month we got a letter from Dr. Blake Busbin who is the AP History teacher at Auburn High School in Auburn, Alabama. He is also the 2017 Alabama History Teacher of the Year. I found his request to be compelling and potentially very interesting for our members.

In this letter Dr. Busbin described the Auburn High Veterans School Project, a project that his students have been leading since 2014. Their purpose is to honor our veterans through preserving their history. To date, they have interviewed 276 veterans, collected several hundred photographs for their Wall of Faces Initiative and hosted a Welcome Home ceremony for Vietnam veterans in their area. In his description of their efforts, Dr. Busbin talked about how these young students have gained a great appreciation and understanding of the lived experiences of our veterans and of military history.

He has invited our chapter to participate in these interviews. He seeks those members who served in Vietnam for an audiorecorded session of oral history with his students and other veterans in the same session. These two-hour sessions will take place at

light lunch items between the 10 am and 1230 pm sessions.

The audio recordings will be provided to the participating veterans, and permission, with their submitted to the Library of Congress Veterans History To aid in the Project. interviews, questions are crafted and shared beforehand to allow the veterans flexibility in choosing memories and stories that they wish to share, and the interviews will be led by a group of 2 to 3 students, not a large audience.

This project has been officially endorsed this year by the Alabama Bicentennial as well as the Department of Defense Vietnam War Commemoration.

Legislative Report by Charlie Wigglesworth

Spring is here and leadership at the our National Headquarters is working hard to protect our In the March benefits. 2019 issue of the Military Officer magazine between pages 12-13 and 92-93 are letters to send to the majority and minority leaders of the House and Senate regarding the Survivor Benefits Plan-Dependency Indemnity Compensation offset. This was a key issue during MOAAs "Storming the Hill". Next month we will be getting postcards to send to our U.S. legislators. Hiahly recommend we all send these in. It works!

In other news from MOAA, the following bills are being supported by MOAA:

Federal - S 21 A bill making continuing appropriations for Coast Guard pay in the event of an appropriations act expired prior to the enactment of new appropriations (official title to be confirmed).

Federal - HR 333 A bill to amend title 10, United States Code, to permit retired members of the Armed Forces who have a service-connected disability rated less than 50 percent to receive concurrent payment of both retired pay and veterans' disability compensation, to extend eligibility for concurrent receipt to chapter 61 disability retirees with less 20 than years service, and for other purposes.

Federal - HR 413 A bill to



amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow the work opportunity credit to small businesses which hire individuals who are members of the Ready Reserve or National Guard, and for other purposes.

Federal - HR 847 A bill to provide interim appropriations for the Retired Coast Guard Serviceman's Family Protection and Survivor Benefits Plans for each fiscal year after fiscal year 2018, and for other purposes.

Federal-S 164 A bill to amend title 10, United States Code, to remove the prohibition on eligibility for TRICARE Reserve Select of members of the reserve components of the Armed Forces who are eligible to enroll in a health benefits plan under chapter 89 of title 5, United States Code.

These are only a small part of what MOAA is advocating for. Be sure the check out your monthly magazine.

Jim hails from Oklahoma, where after obtaining his Bachelor of Science in Education from Southwestern State University, he joined the US Army. Upon graduation from the Rotary Wing Aviator Course, his military career included:





Department of Veterans Affairs Official Sentenced to 11 Years in Prison for \$2 Million Bribery Scheme Involving Program for Disabled Military Veterans

"A former U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) official was sentenced ...for demanding and receiving bribes from three forprofit schools in exchange for enrolling disabled military veterans in those schools and facilitating over \$2 million in payments from the VA using the veterans' federal benefits.

"James King, 63, of Baltimore, Maryland, previously pleaded guilty to an Information alleging one count of honest services and money/ property wire fraud, one count of bribery of a public official, and one count of falsifying records to obstruct an investigation. King was sentenced...to serve 132 months in prison to be followed by three years of supervised release, and to pay \$155,000 in restitution to the VA. Earlier this week, Judge Bates sentenced three school owners and employees who admitted to bribing King...." Extracted from www.va.gov.






