

Legislative Report by Charlie Wigglesworth

Thanksgiving is here and Christmas is around the corner. I pray that all the MOAA members have a safe and wonderful holiday season!

As I have reviewed the issues that MOAA is working, I find some

interesting information to pass on. Some of the issues call for us to send letters to our elected officials. I encourage all MOAA members to read the MOAA magazine or go online to find more information.

Veterans with iPhones can now view their Department of Veterans Affairs medical records through their phone's Health app. VA and Apple began rolling out the capability during the summer but issued formal announcements around Veterans Day.

MOAA has renovated the national headquarters just outside of Washington, DC. The ribbon cutting was on 5 November during the annual membership meeting. The modernized building in Alexandria, Va. keeps MOAA close to decision-makers at the Pentagon and on Capitol Hill, while providing staff with the technological infrastructure to collaborate and engage with lawmakers and members. I would encourage you to stop and visit if you are in the Washington, DC area.

The wife of an Army officer who died in Afghanistan joined a senator who has pushed for the repeal of the "widows tax" for a cable news interview Oct. 30, continuing to garner public attention for an

end to the unfair offset. MOAA continues to fight to end this unjust tax. We need to contact of elected officials on this one.

Amid growing concerns lawmakers will be unable to come to an agreement on the annual defense authorization bill, Sen. Jim Inhofe (R-Okla.) introduced a "skinny NDAA" Oct. 29 to ensure essential defense programs continue uninterrupted. While the new, \$738 billion bill authorizes next year's 3.1% military pay raise, extends bonus and incentive pays, provides for quality-of-life programs for military families, and includes funding for military construction and acquisition programs, it leaves out several MOAA-supported issues that are addressed in either the House or Senate NDAA versions, or in both. This includes language that would:

Prevent the elimination of 18,000 medical billets. End the "widows tax."

Require comprehensive military housing reform. Stop changes and consolidations planned for the commissary and exchange system.

Fund necessary improvements to military spouse employment and education resources.

Again, have a wonderful holiday season.


