Zoom!

Rather than cancel our 17 October meeting, we have decided to try a short Zoom meeting, just to touch base and see how everyone is doing. There's no doubt in my mind that many of you have been participating in some kind of online group meeting during the pandemic and the social distancing we are maintaining. There are several platforms used by work groups, churches, schools and other organizations. The Board has used Zoom for a couple of our meetings and we have found it to be secure and user friendly.

If you have never used Zoom and you wish to participate, can download the application to your desktop or laptop or iPad or iPhone. The application is free to you to use as a meeting participant and is readily available at your particular platform store. I went to zoom.us to get all the latest information and check it out. From this website you can download the application or join a meeting if you have the meeting ID, which comes on the email invitation, and a password if the invitation has one. Legislative Reportby Charlie Wigglesworth

If your life hasn't had any changes is the last few months, just wait a few minutes and it will. 2020 is a year full of changes as we continue



to do our part to combat the COVID 19 virus. Now for news on the legislative front from MOAA.

- 1. DoD has authorized the use of expired identification cards through **June 30, 2021**, extending a deadline that had been set to expire Sept. 30.
- 2. Hackers have tapped into personal information of more than 46,000 veterans kept by the Department of Veterans Affairs, gaining access to data such as Social Security numbers, VA officials said. Unauthorized persons accessed a VA Financial Services Center online application in an attempt to steal payments from VA to private physicians who treat veterans in the community, according to the department.
- 3. As lawmakers return for the final push of the 116th Congress, passage of the FY 2021 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) is high on MOAA's priority list. A key provision in the NDAA will positively impact tens of thousands of veterans exposed to Agent Orange, adding three scientifically linked medical conditions to the list of Agent Orange "presumptive" but only if it's included in the final legislation.
- 4. Members of the general public are allowed to visit graves at Arlington National Cemetery from 8 a.m. to noon as of Sept. 9, part of a relaxing of coronavirus-related regulations that had limited access to family pass holders. Face coverings are mandatory for all visitors and social distancing is "expected. Sites such as the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Arlington House, and the Welcome Center remain closed to visitors. Family pass holders can continue to access the grounds from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to visit a loved one's grave. Restrictions on funeral attendance remain in place, with less than 50 gatherers permitted.
- 5. Military Health System (MHS) reform, directed by Congress via the FY 2017 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA), touches almost every element of the system. While MOAA has most recently been fighting for increased reporting requirements and congressional oversight of military treatment facility (MTF) restructuring and medical billet cuts, we have also been monitoring potential changes to TRICARE since discussions on the next generation of TRICARE contracts, known as T-5, began last year. There is still time to influence T-5. The draft request for proposal (RFP) was just released, (continued in right column)

(continued from left column) and T-5 requirements are still being shaped. The current TRICARE T-2017 contracts run through Dec. 31, 2022.

The key takeaway: While we appreciate congressionally-directed TRICARE reforms are intended to improve access and quality of care, as well as the Defense Health Agency's ability to address contractor performance issues, they must be carefully coordinated with other MHS reforms and consider the impact on TRICARE program costs. Otherwise, beneficiaries could face inadequate TRICARE network availability in some areas, pressures for higher out-of-pocket costs, and a rocky transition to the new contractors.






Officer Elections:

Plan to Use Retired Soldiers as Volunteer Casualty Assistance Officers (CAO) Moves Forward

Washington—When the Army Chief of Staff's Retired Soldier Council met in April 2019, BG Robert W. Bennett, the AG stated that his staff would undertake a comprehensive review of the proposal from the Ft. Stewart Retiree Council to use Retired Soldiers as volunteer "limited duty" CAOs to assist the next of kin of other Retired Soldiers. Despite the impact of the novel coronavirus on Army operations, the Army G-1's Retirement Services Officer (RSO), US Army Human Resources Command (HRC), and US Army Installation Management Command (IMCOM) are developing plans to test this proposal.

In February's Army Echoes, Army RSO requested that Retired Soldiers interested in volunteering for CAO duty and a pilot program to test this concept to send an email with their name and contact information. Over 540 Retired Soldiers volunteered for the pilot program.

HRC, IMCOM, and the Army G-1 have begun developing plans for the pilot, including training, operating procedures, and communications about the pilot to the retired community in the pilot areas. The dates and location for conducting the pilot should be announced this summer. (Extracted from: "Army Echoes," Jun-Sep 2020)

Have You Done Your Retired Pay Account Checkup?

It's important to regularly review and update your retired pay account. Keeping your account current will ensure that DFAS can get in touch with you if there is information you need to know about your retired pay. (1) Is your mailing address current? (2) Do you have a current email address in myPay? (3) Are your allotments correct? (4) Have there been changes in your family (married, lose of spouse, had a child, etc.)? (5) Is your Arrears of Pay beneficiary correct? (6) Is your Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) coverage and beneficiary(ies) correct?

So, pick a date! It doesn't matter if it's your retirement anniversary ate, your birthday, or the first of the year. Set a yearly reminder to look over your information to make sure your account is up to date.

Did you know that a CAO can assist your next of kin when you die?

Army regulations state that Casualty Assistance Centers (CACs) "will provide assistance to the next of kin of a Retired Soldier who dies. When contacted concerning a deceased Retired Soldier, the CAC will communicate with the next of kin to determine the extent of assistance needed. When Families of deceased Retired Soldiers request assistance, CACs will assign a Casualty Assistance Officer." 
