continue wе work with the health care personnel involved with corona virus 19 that is sweeping our Nation and the world, continue to be mindful of "social distancing". Health Care Issues: "Tricare will now cover telephone services for some medical appointments and will eliminate copayments for beneficiaries who use telehealth services in place of an in-person visit to the doctor during the COVID-19 pandemic.

with changes coming to the military health system that include outsourcing some care to community providers, they won't be able to find quality providers access decent care. Ιn locations, families already are facing problems, said members of the Defense Department's Military Family Readiness! Council on April 29. For example, Newport, R.I., military personnel face difficulties finding good pediatricians for their children, while in Europe, service members and their dependents have had trouble accessing mental services, including

telemedicine. They also worry that as the Defense Department pursues plans to restructure the military health system, the problems will get worse."

Chapter News: In the Leadership Circle, the Fort Rucker Chapter was selected as one of only 15 Platinum Level contributors. We are one of only 4 chapters to achieve this level. Montgomery area chapter, through its scholarship foundation since 1991, has awarded over \$300,000 in grants to college-bound hiqh local seniors. VA Releases COVID-19 Response Plan

WASHINGTON – The U.S
Department of Veterans Affairs
(VA) made public, March 27, the
COVID-19 Response Plan it is
executing within its medical
facilities to protect Veterans,
their families and staff.
VA deems the plan a valuable
tool that's useful for the
nationwide medical community.

The "For Official Use Only" designation has been removed from the plan, making it publicly available. This access allows medical providers across the country to review, learn from and provide feedback, as the nation works to combat the COVID-19 pandemic.

"VA has a world-class medical team doing incredible work on the frontlines of this fight," said VA Secretary Robert Wilkie. "We will continue to share best practices and lessons

learned with other government agencies and the private health care system as appropriate so we can defeat COVID-19 as a nation."

VA has shifted some outpatient care to telehealth and some elective and non-emergent procedures have been postponed. This enables Veterans to receive care through minimal contact with staff, saves time and reduces the need for personal protective equipment, making those resources available for critical use.

Additionally, VA will begin to implement two zones within all inpatient units: one for dedicated staff and space to care for COVID-19 patients; the second will be a zone for all other care. These overall changes are aimed at minimizing the risk of infection as VA's medical professionals make decisions based on what's appropriate for the given environment and situation.


