Legislative Report

Now that we "finally" have a fully funded government, the military coalition with MOAA in the lead, is pressing hard to influence how this government will carry out its duties which are required by law.

- 1. The law requires that the president update his interim National Security Strategic Guidance which he issued over a year ago in March 2021. The National Security Strategy report is required of the President to be presented annually to Congress at the time he presents his budget. Neither the budget nor the report had been provided to Congress as of May 5th.
- 2. The annual report of the Secretary of Defense is also required by law to be submitted to Congress. This report lays out the military mission and force structure for the next fiscal year, an explanation of the relationships between the mission and forces needed and the justification for both. Of course, the Secretary must consider the President's National Security Strategy when preparing his report. Whether the President has a National Security Strategy at this point is any ones guess. It may be that the most unlikely report of all, given the current regime, is the National Defense Strategy which is due every four years to the secretaries, chiefs of staff of the military departments and the commanders of the unified and specified commands.
- 3. The President's budget is to be delivered no later than the first Monday in February. Failure to deliver the budget as required (which is the case again this year) is critical in shaping the authorizations and appropriations for the whole government.

The National Defense Authorization Act is just one of the vitally important acts which is pushed aside while waiting for the budget. Last year's budget was released on May 28th. When this year's budget will be available is yet to be seen.


