Our chapter membership count is currently 129.



## **Legislative Report**

Well now we know how at least one element of the U.S. government would attempt to get our "run away" deficit



spending under control. The Congressional Budget Office (CBO) has taken the easy road which is sadly "The road often traveled" to reduce deficit spending. In its biennial report to lawmakers the CBO has offered two options which would "enlist" TRICARE For Life recipients to help lower the deficit. Both of the proposals would cost TRICARE For Life recipients hundreds if not thousands of dollars. One of the proposals would require Medicare eligible beneficiaries who enroll in TFL to pay an annual enrollment fee of \$575.00 for individual coverage or \$1150.00 for family coverage. These fees would be indexed to grow at the same rate as Medicare costs.

The other CBO plan would introduce minimum out of pocket requirements including an \$850.00 deductible. TFL would not cover any of the first \$850.00 of beneficiaries Medicare cost sharing. After the deductible was satisfied TFL would cover only fifty percent of next \$7650.00 in Medicare cost sharing. What does that mean? TFL beneficiaries could face up to \$4675.00 in cost sharing per year.

The question is to FSA or not to FSA (Flexible Spending Accounts). Many large employers including the federal government offer FSA's but not DOD. Flexible Spending Accounts allow for the payment of child care, health care and other cost using tax free income. Sounds like a good deal for service members but it might not be for some. This requires more study and like most issues study on an individual basis.

Maybe some good news if past situations are an indication. This year with the convening of the 118th Congress there will be more military veterans than in many years. There will be 97 military veterans occupying some of the 535 congressional seats.

## MOAA hears about Army Aviation Museum



**SBP Offset by DIC Eliminated**—"If you are a surviving spouse eligible to receive both the SBP Annuity and the DIC from the VA, you should have noticed a change in your February 1, 2023 annuity pay statement. On January 1, 2023, the offset of the SBP annuity by the DIC was eliminated.

- > You now receive your SBP annuity in full.
- > The Special Survivor Indemnity Allowance (SSIA) you have been receiving because of the offset stopped since the offset no longer exists."

#### FINAL INSTRUCTIONS

Quite a number of years ago, a long-time Army friend of mine passed away after suffering a long term illness. A couple of months later, I saw our friend's widow at the Fort Rucker Officers' Club. Sometime during our conversation with her, she walked up to me, and while facing me grabbed me by both my upper arms and said: "The hardest thing I had to do when my husband passed away was write his obituary. Don't you make your wife do that when you pass away!"

Afterwards, I gave that a great deal of thought, and did as she asked - - - wrote my own obituary. Then, I got to thinking. There are many, many other things my wife would have to do. So, I began the arduous task of determining what those things were, and ultimately ended up with a 13-page document that lists and discusses such things as: personal info, SSN, former serial numbers, estate attorney, CPA/tax preparer, stock broker, Veterans' Affairs Officer, Casualty Assistance Officer, Retirement Services Officer, how to report death, SBP, key websites/phone numbers, checklist, preferred burial site, insurance policies and bank account numbers, phone calls to make, fraternal organizations to notify, newspapers to notify, where key papers are located, and similar items/actions.

The Army Echoes Newsletter is a great source of information for updating this 13-page document.
