Legislative Report by Ray Collins

Several recent reports have centered on and

expounded upon the critical issue of the insufficiency of the current military Basic Allowance for Housing (BAH).

To reiterate, for several years, the Department of Defense (DoD) has limited the service members BAH to 95 percent of the authorization for rank and time in service.

The reversal of this wrong has as recently as June 6 received support in the form of S -1823 the Senate version of the BAH

Restoration Act. The withholding of June 9 an Executive Order defive percent of this specific service member's allotment has placed an additional strain on the service family's livelihood. It is estimated that this policy has saved DoD about one billion dollars. The question is how much has it cost in fewer volunteers, higher rates of one and done and lower morale. One recent survey reported that 52 percent of soldiers scored badly on questions that measure optimism and 48 per-

cent reported having little satisfaction or commitment to their job.

President Biden signed on signed to support military and veteran spouses, care givers, and survivors in finding and retaining employment.

The military spouses unemployment and under employment issue has spanned over a decade and has recently improved due to the efforts of DoD and several military service organizations but still remains in double figures.






